INITIATIVE-RELATED ORDINANCES APPROVED OR AMENDED DURING THE 2017/18 FISCAL YEAR

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| <p>Social Host Ordinances (SHOs)</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Chula Vista amended its SHO to include marijuana-specific language in May 2017• Escondido amended the SHO in February 2018 to include marijuana and controlled substance language |
| <p>Other Alcohol-Related Policies of Local Control and Key Successes</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Oceanside passed a craft beer ordinance, which prohibits new breweries from opening “by right” and requires a public review process• Lemon Grove voted to ban alcohol possession and other Alcohol-Related consumption in the city’s public parks• Encinitas unanimously voted to adopt DAO, becoming the 2nd municipality in San Diego County to do so• Carlsbad rejected allowing distilleries in downtown zone, but did approve restaurants that could serve alcohol• Carlsbad denied beer and wine license for K1 Speed• Lemon Grove reinstated the Planning Commission who is a part of the process of approving new and existing alcohol licenses |

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Reduced Access to Marijuana

- County of San Diego Board of Supervisors approved a ban on the sale and cultivation of marijuana in the county's unincorporated areas
- Oceanside voted unanimously to extend its Reduced Access to Marijuana ban on medical marijuana dispensaries and approved an additional ban on retail sales of marijuana for recreational use
- Carlsbad banned all commercial marijuana activity
- Del Mar and Encinitas City Council confirmed their ban on all pot businesses, retail, cultivation, manufacturing
- Special events amended vendor policy language to prohibit pro-marijuana merchandise
- Efforts to submit complaints to the Bureau of Cannabis Control (BCC) and Neighborhood Code have been the catalyst for better enforcement of San Diego Marijuana Regulations and BCC regulations regarding Advertising. Permitted Licensees have started to identify their license numbers on advertisement like sign spinners, magazine and on billboards.

Crime Free Multi-Housing

- Vista adopted the first municipal CFMH ordinance in San Diego County and extended the sunset clause to August 2020
- Developed in partnership with SAY, the MSF-NSW workgroup and with local housing attorney's a lease addendum specific to marijuana smoking in rental properties that address changes to the law post prop 64 (AUMA)
